Game Title **Shanghai II®: Dragon's Eye**

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Game Description *Puzzle and strategy fanatics – get ready for Shanghai II!* The object of this game is simple: match up tiles and remove them from the board. Plan ahead—if you remove certain tiles too soon you could find yourself trapped. Shanghai II is easy to learn and hard to master. Players have a variety of game layouts to choose from.

Hints & Tips

Shanghai Style

- Concentrate on removing tiles that block the most tiles. Novice layouts have fewer blocking tiles, and the Master layouts have a lot of them.
- Identify as many matching pairs as possible. Carefully check for the tiles that need to be unblocked.
- Concentrate on long rows than on tall stacks.
- Look for triples (3 of a kind). Leave the tile that blocks the fewest important tiles.
- Remove 4 of a kind right away to free any other blocked tiles.
- Concentrate, like chess, plan your moves ahead.
- If you don't play your tile right the game tells you that you have **NO MORE MATCHES**
you can always back up one move, shuffle, repeat or try a new game.
